



GLOUCESTERSHIRE ASSOCIATION OF BOYS' CLUBS

At our AGM last November we were able to hear from our Guest Speaker, David Stickels, the Principal Youth & Community Officer for Gloucestershire County Council, the outcome of a Review of the Youth & Community Service in Gloucestershire. This has resulted in a "Development Plan for the Service 1987-90" which had only two months previously been adopted by the Recreation & Leisure Committee.

A short time later the Association was asked to respond to a Development Review of the Boys' Club Movement initiated by the NABC. In order to make the response the Association set up a small Review Group from the Executive Committee under the Chairmanship of Mrs Anne Cadbury JP. The Group took the view that it was more appropriate to review the work of the GABC in light of the changes already taking place in the county. Consequently a number of recommendations were presented to the Executive Committee where they received unanimous support. These recommendations (not in order of priority) were:-

- 1. Officers of the Association should meet with opposite numbers from GYA (and other organisations as required) to discuss areas for future co-operation and support.
- The services of the Association should be extended to boys and young men 'wherever they are' rather than restrict to Clubs and formal youth groups.
- 3. The Activity programme should be reviewed with a new emphasis on a balance of Creative as well as Physical Activities and on the improvement of methods by which these are publicised and made known to members.

The co-operation already established between GYA and the GCC Y&C Service should be developed to avoid unnecessary duplication. More prestigious events at 'County' level should be held as well as more local 'taster' events aimed at broadening Club programmes.

- 4. The Association's finances should be strengthened by increased fund raising through the establishment of a Fund Raising sub Committee rather than expect this to be undertaken by staff.
- 5. The Joint Industrial Training Committee should maintain at least our present level of Courses and aim for a gradual development of them to increase our market share of this area of work.
- 6. There should be more co-operation with other agencies involved in training for club-based work in order to maximise the use of the training resource to the benefit of members and adults involved in youth work in Gloucestershire.
- 7. Kerne Bridge Adventure Centre and other residential Centres should be used as much as possible by affiliated Clubs and Kerne should be properly maintained.
- 8. The work of many Clubs in their programmes for children of 11 to 14 years should be supported, particularly in smaller communities where very limited provision exists.

The progressive implementation of several of these recommendations has since started to take place and significant progress made to enhance the overall work and objectives of the Association.

The renovation of Kerne Bridge Adventure Centre has been a major feature of the work undertaken during the year. The contractor, P M Ashton, started the work in June 1987. Although originally scheduled for ten weeks the contract soon encountered several problems, made even worse by the seemingly continuous rains during June and July. The Building Inspector insisted on a reinforced concrete raft foundation being built for the extension to the station building, which would take the dormitory, shower and staff rooms. This obviously increased our costs quite considerably and it also interrupted the schedualing of the other work which in turn increased the overall time of the project.

As the work progressed on the station building additional work proved to be necessary, including a completely new floor in the kitchen and a new septic tank.

The contractors eventually finished their work in January 1988. Unfortunately this did not make the Centre immediately available for use because the additional structural work during the renovation used up the funds set aside for furniture and decorations. Fortunately Smith's Charity and the NABC appreciated our difficulties and gave additional grants to help with the furnishings and decorations. Even so the final furnishing could only be completed by doing much of it ourselves, so the Association's staff together with a few volunteers spent several days down at Kerne redecorating the Centre, whilst Tony Crane did an outstanding job of building all the bunk beds.

During this time many youth groups who had been regular users were pressing us to make the Centre available to them again. So even though the decorations were not finished and the furniture and fittings not yet in place, groups were anxious to commence use of the Centre and without exception told us afterwards how pleased they were with the 'new' Kerne Bridge.

Her Majesty's Lord Lieutenant of Gloucestershire, Colonel M St J V Gibbs, CB DSO TD JP, officially re-Opened Kerne Bridge Adventure Centre on Friday 6th May 1988 (two days after the Centre had been broken into! - fortunately with no loss or damage other than to the door). This event gave us the opportunity of inviting and expressing our thanks to all the Trusts and Supporters who made the renovation of Kerne possible and to enable them to see the fine facility that is now available to young people.

We would not have been able to achieve all this without the very substantial support of Gloucestershire County Council, who through the Capital Building Programme for Voluntary Youth Organisations, administered by the Recreation and Leisure Committee, gave us grants over two years of some £31,600 - 75% of the original estimated cost. Glearly this amount of support would have been difficult to find elsewhere and would have taken an immense amount of time to raise by other means. To the Gloucestershire County Council our very grateful thanks!

Our Joint Industrial Training Committee continues to organise Courses for young people at work. Over the past 12 months 4 x 5 day Adjustment to Industry Courses were held at Cowley Manor, including a mixed Course to cater for young employees in the commercial sections; 3 x 6 day Attitudes in Industry Courses at the Poole & Dorset Adventure Centre and 1 x 11 day Responsibility in Industry Course at Plas yr Antur, Fairbourne, Gwynedd for Senior Apprentices and Student Engineers.

The Training Officers who make up our Committee are well aware of the changing needs of young people and their companies, our series of Courses are therefore under constant review and evaluation. This was particularly evident this year and has resulted in several changes to the Adjustment to Industry Course programme which brought a greater degree of participation in business exercises and case studies and several new Speakers. Another feature that proved valuable was the introduction of an end of Course formal Dinner. in which the students play a major part hosting several visitors from their companies as well as a Guest Speaker. This more participative and demanding Course requires a lot from the Course Tutors, who are all volunteers from the Police and Industry.

In order to well equip the Tutors our usual briefing session was considerably extended into a full day's training when, with the help of Sergeants Mike Barton and Jerry Prendergast from the Police Training Dept, the Tutors undertook several exercises aimed at increasing their awareness of human behaviour and later in the day participated in exercises and case studies to be used on the Course.

The Attitudes in Industry Courses were the focus of a particularly searching review which highlighted changing needs which the Committee felt could no longer be met by our present format. The three Courses held at Poole this year are therefore to be the last. It is sad to leave a Centre that has served us very well for over 10 years, but it was felt that we need a different style of Course. Considerable work then took place to find a location and staff team who could deliver a Course tailored to meet our specific require-Many Centres were visited before we found a formula that does we believe, offer some very exciting We are planning to use a Methodist prospects. Conference Centre at Cliff College, Calver, Derbyshire as the base and the staff from Plas yr Antur to run the Personal Development Course. This will use outdoor pursuits such as Caving, Climbing etc to focus on learning in such areas as Communications, Leadership and Team Development. These Courses, 3 weeks, are to take place in February 1989.

This new format will strengthen our links with Plas yr Antur and whilst we shall be using different activities in a different part of the country we feel that the use of the Plas Staff team will be beneficial and will enable us to enhance and develop our Responsibility in Industry Courses as a result. As a voluntary organisation our work could not continue without considerable support from numerous valued friends and Trust funds, not least of whom is the County Council. In addition to this support the Association is continually involved in fund raising to support its own work and that of our member Clubs. Some Clubs avail themselves of the opportunities presented to them by the NABC Club Week to raise funds, many others receive generous support for various projects and initiatives from such sources as Smith's Charity and the BBC Children in Need Appeal.

Our own Fund Raising Committee under Dorrie and Arthur Brown continue their sterling work for the Association. Thanks to the generosity of our President and Lady Vestey two Recitals were held at their home at Stowell Park by the Montpellier Piano Trio in October, and more recently by Miss Susan Bird in June. Our regular Carol Concert with the Thames Head Singers was held just before Christmas and the now well established, if somewhat more bizarre, Sponsored Jailbreak, again took place from Gloucester Prison and raised over £2,350 for ourselves and 7 other Charities.

A comprehensive report of the Association's Activity Programme follows later in this report. We wish however, to draw attention to a number of events that have taken place outside our more regular programme. Of these it is appropriate to highlight the co-operation that is growing in the county between ourselves, the Local Authority Youth & Community Service and the Gloucestershire Youth Association. This development has become possible after several joint ventures between the three organisations - Pop Quiz, Archery, Fishing etc., as well as occasions where each organisation has activity promoted events organised by other organisations.

We propose to build on co-operation and collaboration and thereby avoid duplication of effort and confusion of activities. We believe this will result in a better and more balanced programme for Clubs.

The Association has been actively involved in the development of residential and activity weekends within the programme of several of our Clubs, Whaddon & College Boys' Club, Nailsworth Boys' Club and the Gotherington Boys' Club, as well as running County Water Sports Weekends at South Cerney Water Sports Centre and Adventure Activity Weekends at the Biblins Adventure Centre.

It was hoped that these would be an encouraging factor in the take up of Senior Member Training but unfortunately this has not proved to be the case. The Association has however, again been active in helping participation in the Duke of Edinburgh's Award Scheme and in enabling members of several Clubs to gain canoeing skills.

The Association and our Clubs continue to be very active participants of the NABC, both at Regional and National level. Successes at sports events are recorded later. Nailsworth Boys' Club, at the NABC's request, hosted the SW Regional round of a National Computer Competition sponsored by U.S Gold Computer Magazines.

Neil Skeen of the Whaddon & College Boys' Club was our representative on the Poole Sail Training ship week's cruise in the Channel. The Crew was made up of Boys' Club members from throughout the South West. Members of the Association's Executive Committee, together with several Club Leaders, were delegates at the Annual Regional Conference in Torquay.

It is at local Club level where the ongoing contact and work goes on with young people. The Association continues to offer support and practical assistance to Clubs - this will vary from an occasional visit, to help with fundraising or an insurance query, or sustained help and support over a particular period of difficulty. Quite rightly much of the Association's ongoing work is in the background supporting Clubs, their Leaders and Management Committees, utilizing the contacts and knowledge that our 'county' position provides.

This overview gives us a privileged insight into the considerable work undertaken by so many Leaders, Helpers, Committee Members and Supporters and it is to them we send our thanks.

Our thanks also go to our valued supporters, individuals, companies and Trusts, in particular Smith's Charity who have again given the Association and very many Clubs substantial support and encouragement, as well as to the County Council of whose substantial support we have already mentioned.

HONORARY TREASURER'S REPORT AND SUMMARY OF ACCOUNTS

Year Ended 31 March 1988

The accounts shown on the next two pages are, following our now well established practice, in a summarised form, and copies of detailed audited accounts are available upon request or can be inspected at the Association's office.

In my report last year I gave notice of a sizeable reduction in our funds in the 87/88 financial year. This is clearly shown in the reduction of our Bank balances and decrease in investment income.

The fact that we have been able to end the year with a modest surplus shows that our Kerne Bridge Adventure Centre Appeal not only reached it's original targets but was also able to cope with the extra expenditure which the project necessitated.

Credit is also due to our Fund Raising Committee who once again raised substantial amounts, and the contribution we again received from our Industrial Courses and Sponsored Jailbreak.

KERNE BRIDGE ADVENTURE CENTRE

In 1960 the Association founded an Adventure and Training Centre in a disused railway station at Kerne Bridge. The Station which had been derelict for some time, was leased to us on a six month tenancy and, with some financial help and a tremendous amount of work by the boys themselves, was converted with bunk-room, day room and dining area, small kitchen and toilet block. Trains were occasionally still running so the platform side of the station had to be strictly out of bounds.

The scheme caught the imagination of Boys in Clubs and the Centre was in almost constant use despite fairly spartan provision. Much of the attraction rests on the unusual character of the station and its delightful situation on the Wye with easy access to the Forest of Dean. Canoeing, Rock Climbing, Expeditions, Night Adventures, Pony Trekking and Committee weekends have all featured in the programme clubs devise for themselves. Kerne soon became a popular centre for groups from all over the country.

The line was closed in 1964 and as a parting gift British Roil very generously gave us a coach which they installed on the platform. This encouraged us to draw up plans to provide better facilities and slightly more accommodation. British Rail offered us the site at advantageous terms and with the help of the Ministry of Education, the Gloucestershire County Council and many local supporters we were able to convert the station and coach into a most attractive Centre with accommodation for 10 boys and 2 staff.

Our hopes to cater for more boys and offer the facilities to groups further afield were well received - the Centre was soon in use for around 3,000 bed/nights per year and has remained as popular for 20 years.

This constant usage by so many youngsters, together with deterioration caused by weather conditions, brought us in 1984 again to the point of a major conversion. Unfortunately the coach, which has served as the dormitory, was deteriorating to such a state that it was becoming unfit to sleep in. We therefore planned an extension to the station building to provide sleeping accommodation and at the same time hoped to renovate the whole Centre.

This project was estimated to cost £50,000, and thanks to the generous support of the Gloucestershire County Council, many local and national Trusts, together with fundraising activities of member Clubs and the Association, the funds were raised and the work is now complete - thus ensuring that Kerne Bridge Adventure Centre is able to serve young people for many more years.


GREAT WESTERN LINE -MONMOUTH TO ROSS-ON-WYE

Clubs interest and involvement in our activity programme has been about the same as usual during the year, which in truth really means that more clubs could participate in certain events.

Our programme of activities has been a full one with our Sports & Activity Committee meeting regularly throughout the year. The season started with the annual Fishing Contest at Frampton, we were also represented in the NABC National Angling event at Peterborough by the Dowty Group Apprentices. Another Open Fishing event was held in conjunction with the Gloucestershire Youth Association and the County Youth Service on the Gloucester & Sharpness Canal when some 80 boys participated, with the winners receiving prizes kindly donated by the British Waterways Leisure Board.


Unfortunately for the second year, our Swimming Gala was not held due to lack of support. Our first Five-a-Side Football Championships (14-16 years) took place in December with the winners going through to the Regional Finals, from which they could have gone through to the National event that would have resulted in playing on the Wembley pitch prior to the League Cup Final. However, this did not materialise due to us not winning the Regional event. Likewise our Under 14's and Under 19's Five-a-Side winners played in the Regional event at Exeter, but alas also did not proceed any further, although Nailsworth Boys' Club were Regional Runners-up (Under 14's).


Our Chess Champion this year came from Westfields Youth Club and then had the experience to compete in the NABC National Finals at Keele University.

Once again we ran a successful Cross Country event in association with the GYA, from the Gotherington Boys' Club, this year without postponements, which allowed time to select our teams to represent us in the NABC National Championships at Keele University. Although we did not cross the tape in the first three, our Colts (11-12's) team gained a respectable 9th position from 22 teams. Also in the Senior event a Woodchester Youth Club runner attained the 9th individual placing, a very good performance indeed, with two other boys from the Lydney ABC gaining commendable places.

Badminton was especially well supported and as usual we had programmed this as a one-day event to cover our 3 age groups, but after receiving a larger than expected entry (for which we were well pleased) we had to play off the Under 14's and Under 19's on the original day and convene another day to play off the Under 16's age group. Winners from this event went through to the Regional round at the Gloucester Leisure Centre.

Unfortunately Table Tennis could do with a similar injection of interest from clubs, although there was a slight increase in numbers to the previous two years.

On the Cricket field, four Sunday fixtures were arranged but finished up victims of the bad weather that resulted in the Six-a-Side competition being called off, as did the two inter county matches against Wales and Oxfordshire Association.

However, we did play the Bristol Association of Boys' Clubs and won the game that had an exciting finish.

Continuing in the wet area - so be it in the proper way! - Canoeing has been prominent in our activities involving a weekend at South Cerney Water Sports Centre and evening training sessions, culminating in the GABC 50 Mile Canoe Test weekend from Kerne Bridge on the River Wye, plus the NABC 100 Mile Canoe Test on the Rivers Wye and Severn from the Worcester Racecourse basecamp over the Spring Bank Holiday.

Our version of the TV Competition 'Super Stars' again attracted almost 100 boys, in teams of 4, to take part in the 10 events - Sprint, Swim, Javelin, Long Jump, Archery, Squat Thrusts, Dips on Parallel Bars, Basketball Shooting, Football and Cross Country, to find our 1988 Super Stars. Also this year entries were forthcoming for all 3 age groups, as this has not been possible for the previous two years.

Similarly our Multi-Sports event took place at the Stonehouse Youth Centre, with a disappointing number of teams not turning out on the day. However, the participating teams appeared to enjoy the event where Club Leaders have the task of finding a team of 6 to play Darts, Five-a-Side Soccer, Chess, Pool, Table Tennis and Table Football.

Members from the Winchcombe Youth Club were very successful in the NABC Middlesex Association Open Judo Championships, when they collected 2 Silver medals (2nd placings) and 1 Bronze (3rd placing).

The South West Regional Festival of Sport for the first time was split over two days, the first with Snooker, Pool and Five-a-Side Soccer being held at the Plaza Centre, Exeter, our only success here being the Under 14's pair from Longford JFC winning their event and going through to the National Finals at Leicester.

The second day at the Gloucester Leisure Centre was for Darts, Table Tennis and Badminton, where a number of our boys from Nailsworth Boys' Club and Coleford Youth Centre won their Badminton events and qualified for the National Finals.

Pool continues to be as popular as ever with the League Competition preliminary matches being played in areas and finalists coming together on separate nights to decide the winners. Also the competition leading up to the NABC Regional event produced some exciting games in all the 3 age groups. Similarly the Snooker event, in two age groups, created some keen competition played in a Gloucester Snooker Hall.

It was disappointing that we have a number of specialist Boxing Clubs affiliated to us, but alas no entries for the NABC Boxing Championships!

Entries in the Darts event and the .22 Rifle Shooting held at the Dowty Range could have benefited with more teams participating. Gloucester Gordon League Club continued their usual success by winning their competition in the NABC Rugby Sevens tournament.

In the Arts & Crafts section St Michaels Boys' Club again were the only club to enter the NABC Festival and we were pleased to hear that Peter Kelly again won the Pottery Award for the 3rd Year Running! Peter has now left St Michaels so this will give someone else the chance next year. However, this is again likely to be a boy from the same club as his colleagues also won prizes in the same competition.

During the year some of the events have been run in conjunction with our colleagues at the Gloucestershire Youth Association and the County Youth Service, a Video Pop Contest and Archery being two of these events, in addition to some of those already reported.

We are grateful to many individuals, sponsors and organisations as well as our own Sports & Activities Committee, for their continued assistance which has enabled a successful programme to be completed.
